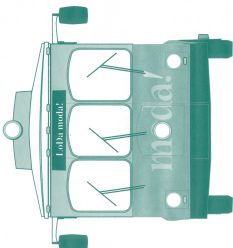

Again, welcome to our beautiful district. We are glad you are here.

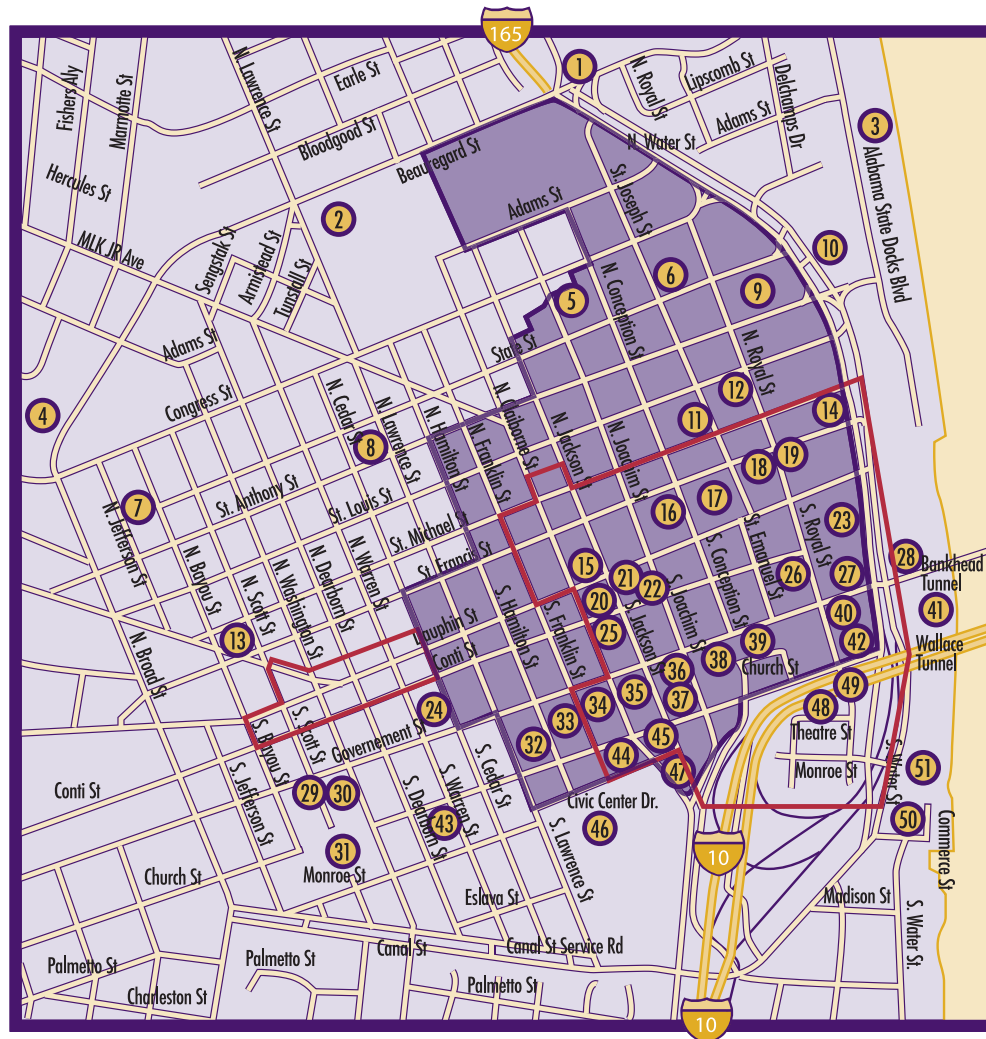

**ABOUT OUR AREA:**

**CLIMATE:** Mobile boasts a semi-tropical climate with Gulf breezes allowing warm summer days and mild winters. It is muggy more often than not and showers should be anticipated every summer afternoon. Freezing temperatures are not recorded every winter but with the humid atmosphere, cold weather can feel very cold. Average temperatures range from 40° to 60° in January; 57° to 79° in April; 73° to 91° in July; and 69° to 87° in September. Hurricane season runs from June 1 through November 30 with most of the activity between August 15 and September 30.

**DRESS:** Bring light-weight, cool, loose-fitting clothing during the summer. Bring clothing for cold to mild weather during the winter as temperatures can change drastically from day to day. Casual clothing is worn year round but some of the finer restaurant require a coat and tie for dinner.

**DRINKING:** The legal drinking age is 21. Closing times vary widely from bar to bar and day to day. Consult your directory for information on individual bars. Many of our bars are “private” clubs, so you may be asked to fill out a membership card. It’s a little cumbersome, but a small price to pay to enjoy our nightlife all

night long! There are two entertainment districts in Downtown Mobile in which you may leave an establishment with an adult beverage. Feel free to enjoy your beverage as you walk around the districts. Refer to the map on the back inside cover of the Guide for entertainment district boundaries.

**DRIVING:** Many downtown streets are one-way so look for directional signs before turning.

**GRATUITIES:** A 15% tip is standard. You may want to tip 20% for good service. Some restaurants automatically add an 18% gratuity to bills for parties of six or more.

**PARKING METERS:** Parking meters are located on major streets throughout Downtown Mobile. You should expect to pay 25¢ for each 15 minutes – up to two hours. You must pay the meters Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Parking on Dauphin Street is free, but limited to two hours. During special events some restrictions may be posted and bags may be placed on meters where no parking is allowed. Do not park at bagged meters. Watch for yellow "Parade Route" signs during Mardi Gras. Parade routes differ from parade to parade but if you park on a parade route within two hours of a parade, your car will be towed. When in doubt, ask a passerby. If still in doubt, move your car.

**POSTAL SERVICE:** The Main Post Office is located at 250 St. Joseph Street. Call 251-602-1708 for general information.

**SMOKING:** City ordinance prohibits smoking in any public building, indoor or outdoor sporting event or restaurant except in designated smoking areas. Smoking is prohibited on public transportation and on the sidewalks within the Business Improvement District. Smoking is currently allowed in bars and lounges.

**TIME ZONE:** Mobile is located in the Central Time Zone.

**TAXES:** Sales tax in the City of Mobile is 10% for retail sales, services and restaurants; 14% for lodging.

**TOURIST INFORMATION:** Mobile's Welcome Center is located in the Ft. Condé Historic Site at 150 South Royal Street. Open daily from 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p. m., except for major holidays. 251-208-7304.

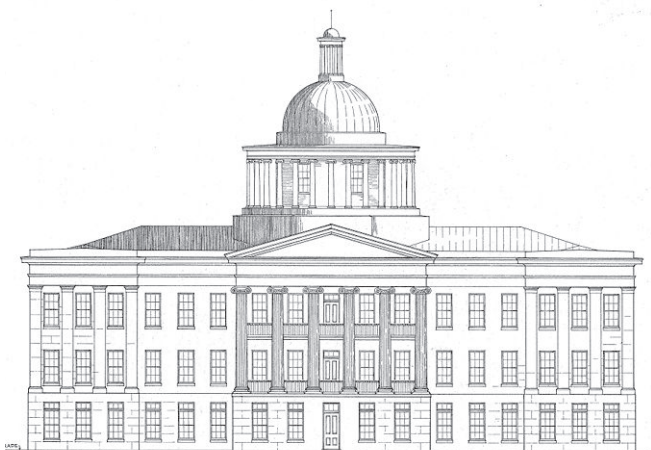

**ADMIRAL SEMMES MONUMENT** • 1900 • Rear Admiral Raphael Semmes served as captain of the “Sumter” and the “Alabama” for three years during the Civil War. During that time, he defied the Federal naval forces by successfully commandeering cargo vessels vital to the Federal cause, totaling \$6,000,000 in loss. Rear Admiral Raphael Semmes’ naval career ended when the Alabama was sunk by the USS Kearsage off Cherbourg, France on June 19, 1864. Additionally, he practiced law before and after the Civil War. • Government at Royal Street

**BIG ZION AME ZION CHURCH** • 1860 • Property was purchased by the congregation of the Franklin Street United Methodist Church to build this mission church for African-Americans. It was remodeled in 1896 in the Medieval Revival style • 112 Bayou Street • 251-433-8431

**CATHEDRAL-BASILICA OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION** • 1834-1849 • This is the oldest Christian Church in the state of Alabama. The first Bishop of Mobile, Michael Portier, erected a cathedral worthy of its name – architect Claude Beroujon’s plan was of Roman Corinthian Basilica design. This historic building is located on the site of the Spanish burial grounds and has been in constant use since 1850. On May 10, 1962, Pope John XXIII gave it the rank of Minor Basilica. 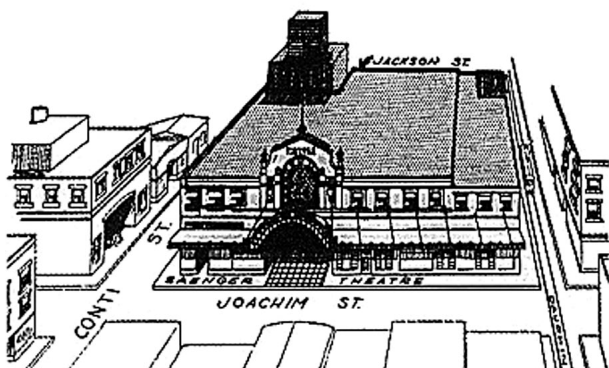

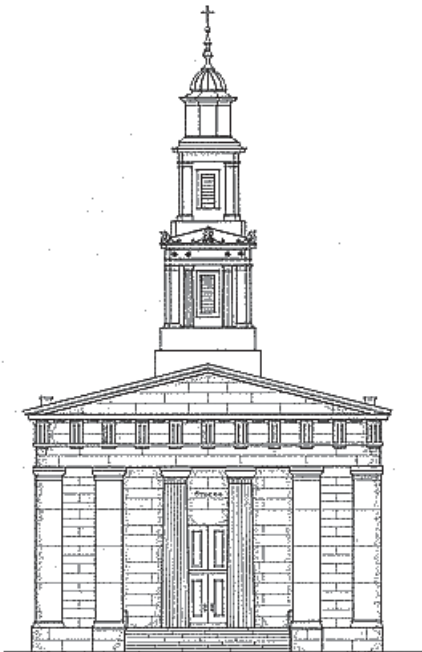

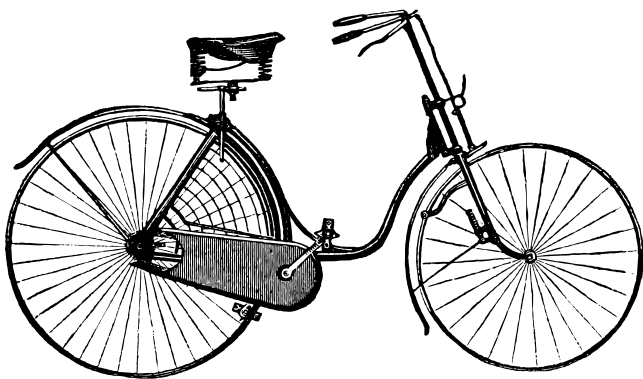

- 8 hours: \$30

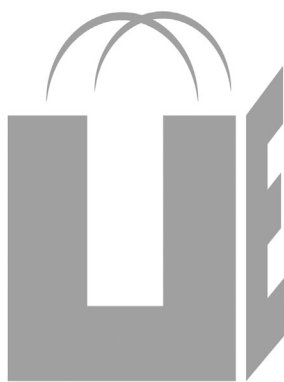
